We have traditionally kept our camp fees substantially lower than the actual cost to make camp affordable for many families. **Remaining fees need to be paid by Monday, June 22.** Some funds are available from the camping ministries reserve fund, but this year we will depend on offerings to cover 39 percent of our family camp budget (\$10,000).
